**Appendix B
Merchant Records: Sales of Housewares in the Region**

The following listing provides a sample of merchant's accounts, as recorded in daybooks, ledgers, and account books for stores located in the Upper Potomac and northern Shenandoah region in the period of 1750-1865. For the purpose of this study, I define this region as the area currently encompassed by: Berkeley, Hampshire, Hardy, Jefferson and Morgan counties in West Virginia; Clarke, Fauquier, Frederick, Loudoun, Prince William, Shenandoah, and Warren counties in Virginia; and Allegany and Washington counties in western Maryland. This appendix of store records is part of a dissertation study, copies of which will be available from the University of Virginia's Alderman Library or the UMI microfilm publication services.

The store records transcribed here provide a limited sample. Area archives preserve only fragments of the total number of store accounts generated in that time period and region. Having reviewed records available in local archives, I list below the pertinent information of selected merchant records, with a focus on transactions involving domestic or imported ceramic housewares.

I. Introduction

General stores in the period of 1750-1865 typically maintained their sales records in two forms. Store clerks recorded each sale in some form of "Daybook" which listed the date, the customer's name, the item purchased, and the price to be debited against the customer's account with the store. Most general stores maintained accounts for each customer, and accepted cash, services, and "country produce" (such as livestock, grain or wool) from their customers as payment of those debts. A daybook was usually recorded in simple chronological order, listing all sales and associated credits and debits. Those detailed descriptions were later summarized into "ledger" and "account" books, which were organized by customer name, collecting all credit and debit information for each customer in a given year onto one summary accounting. The descriptions of each sale in the daybooks were often much more detailed than those provided in the ledgers and account books.

Relevant sales transactions from these records involving housewares are itemized below, and are set forth in a manner that closely approximates the way the store clerks wrote them down. These relevant housewares include ceramic food wares (e.g., crocks, cups, mugs, saucers, plates, and dishes), glass wares (e.g., tumblers, bottles, and wine glasses), tea sets and kettles, coffee sets and pots, sets of table utensils (knives, forks and

spoons), and ceramic housewares (e.g., chamber pots). Each customer listed below likely purchased other items, such as groceries, fabrics or hardware, along with these housewares, but those other goods are not itemized here.

I examined a total of approximately 5,592 pages of daybooks, ledgers and account books for 20 stores that were located in the region of my survey at some point during the period of 1750-1865. These accounting records contained an approximate total of 2,182 sales transactions specifically involving housewares (as defined above), out of approximately 124,791 total sales transactions of all types. I define a "sales transaction" for this purpose as each one-line entry in a daybook or ledger that reflected the purchase of one or more products by a customer. For each of the accounting records described below, I calculated the total of sales transactions recorded in each daybook or ledger. I also calculated the total number of sales transactions involving housewares that were recorded in each book. Sales transactions involving housewares comprised approximately less than two percent ($2,182/124,791 = .0174$) of the total sales transactions of all types in the available merchant accounting records surveyed in this study.

For the daybook records, each pertinent transaction is listed below by date of sale (month, day and year), the name of the customer to whom the purchase was charged and the person who made the purchase, the items purchased (as described in the daybook), and the prices charged. The person who purchased the item was typically identified in the daybook entries with a notation of "D" or "Dp," for "debit per," followed by an identifier, such as "Dp self" or "Dp wife." Thus, an entry of "William Smith Dp wife" indicated that Mr. Smith's wife made a purchase at the store and charged it to Mr. Smith's account. Clerks also used the notations "ditto" and "do." to indicate that an item was the same as the item which preceded it in the listings of a customer's purchases.

Store clerks often listed a price per unit next to the description of the item purchased, and then totaled the price for all those units on the right-hand column, listed here under the heading of "Prices." For example, an entry might state "2 bowls @ .25 50." In other instances, a clerk noted a price per unit next to an item, but neglected to total up the price for the number of units of that item. I use the abbreviation "npl" to indicate that no price was listed for an item, and "ntpl" to indicate that a price per unit was listed, but no total price for the purchase of those units was calculated and listed by the store clerk in the daybook entry.

The prices listed often appear in pence, shillings and pounds, reading each figure from right to left in that order. For example, "1/2/6" is 1 pound, 2 shillings and 6 pence; "1/3" is 1 shilling and 3 pence; "2/~" or "2/" is 2 shillings; and "~/8" or "/8" is 8 pence. In general, 12 pence equaled 1 shilling, and 20 shillings equaled 1 pound. However, clerks often recorded a price of more than 12 pence or more than 20 shillings for an item, without converting the figure to include the next associated increment of shillings or pounds (e.g., "~/~16" instead of "~/1/4," or "~/30/~" instead of "1/10/~"). The value of goods that could be purchased for pounds, shilling and pence varied from region to

region in the United States, even within the same time period, and merchants also varied in the calculations they used to convert pounds and shillings to dollars and cents when administering their customer accounts.

II. Store Records

I located and examined surviving sales records for the following merchandise stores:

- f. Fauquier County, Virginia Store Operated by James Pickett, 1814-1832;
- g. Washington County, Maryland Store Operated by William Dickey, 1817-1819;
- h. Leesburg, Loudoun County, Virginia Store Operated by an Unidentified Merchant, 1830-1831;
- i. Middleburg, Loudoun County, Virginia Store Operated by John M. McVeigh, 1830-1831;
- j. Martinsburg, Berkeley County, Virginia Store Operated by Isaac Lauck & Company, 1831;
- k. Hillsborough, Loudoun County, Virginia Store Operated by Samuel Clendening, 1834;
- l. Loudoun County, Virginia Store Operated by an Unidentified Merchant, 1837-1839;

- m. Leitersburg, Washington County, Maryland Store Operated by Fletcher & Lanz, 1838-1839;
- n. Loudoun County, Virginia Store Operated by an Unidentified Merchant, 1839-1840;
- o. Winchester, Shenandoah County, Virginia Store Operated by David Barrett, 1839-1843;
- p. Hatcherville, Fauquier County, Virginia Store Operated by an Unidentified Merchant, 1841-1849;
- q. Strasbourg, Shenandoah County, Virginia Store Operated by Strickley's & Company, 1842-1843;
- r. Loudoun County, Virginia Store Operated by an Unidentified Merchant, 1843-1850;
- s. Strasbourg, Shenandoah County, Virginia Store Operated by Strickley's & Company, 1844-1845; and
- t. New Market, Shenandoah County, Virginia Store Operated by John W. Rice, 1856-1866.

Transcriptions of pertinent sales records are set out in the following sections II.A-II.T, addressing each of these store records in detail.

A. Winchester, Shenandoah County, Virginia Store Operated by David Allason, 1761-1763.

Falmouth, Stafford County, Virginia Store Operated by William Allason, *Daybook*, October 1, 1761 to May 16, 1763; David and William Allason Papers, 1722-1847; Business Records Collection No. 13, Miscellaneous Microfilm No. 1372, Library of Virginia, Richmond, Virginia.

This *Daybook* was used by store clerks to record the daily sales transactions of a general store that was located in Winchester, Shenandoah County, Virginia, and operated by David Allason. This book is organized in the manner of a typical daybook. This

accounting record contains approximately 442 pages of sale entries, with an average of 25 sales transactions recorded on each page, for a total of 11,050 total sales transactions. The array of goods reflected in these records indicate that this store operated as a general store, offering for sale a broad assortment of goods, groceries and produce. These *Daybook* records were later summarized by the store personnel in the Shenandoah Store *Ledger*, for November, 1761 to November, 1763, which arranged the sales transactions and payment information by customer name, recording all debits and credits associated with each customer in summary form.

A *Daybook* of the Falmouth Store, operated by William Allason, and covering the period of October 1, 1761 to May 16, 1763, concerns a business operation that was located in the Tidewater region of Virginia and outside the area of my study. William Allason operated this store at the same time that his brother, David Allason, operated a store in Winchester, the latter of which is within my area of study. I did not transcribe individual sales transactions from this accounting record of the Falmouth store, because that store was located outside the area of my study. However, it is notable that this *Daybook* for the Falmouth store contains approximately 483 pages of entries, with an average of 25 sales transactions recorded on each page, for a total of 12,075 transactions. In a comparable two-year period, the Winchester store recorded approximately the same number of total sales transactions.

Relevant sales transactions involving housewares recorded in the Winchester store's *Daybook* are itemized below in a manner similar to the way the store clerks recorded them in the *Daybook*. The sales of housewares listed below total to just 344 sales transactions out of that total of approximately 11,050, or approximately three percent of the total sales transactions in the daybook. The prices are listed primarily in references to pounds, shilling and pence.

This *Daybook* was used by store clerks to record the daily sales transactions of the “Lauck & Stephen” general store that was located in Martinsburg, Berkeley County, Virginia (later West Virginia), and operated by Isaac Lauck & Company. This book is organized in the manner of a typical daybook. This accounting record contains approximately 500 pages of sales entries. I reviewed a sample of 6 months of such sales entries in detail (for April-June, 1831 and September-November, 1831), which were recorded on approximately 230 pages, with an average of 22 sales transactions recorded on each page, for a total of approximately 5,060 total sales transactions in those sample

periods.

Relevant sales transactions involving housewares during that time period are itemized below in a manner similar to the way the store clerks recorded them in the *Daybook*. The sales of housewares listed below total to just 47 sales transactions out of that total of approximately 5,060, or approximately one percent of the total sales transactions in the daybook. The pricing information is listed in dollars and cents.

Given the clarity with which this daybook recorded prices for each sales transaction, I also calculated the total sales in dollar and cents (including all products sold) for three sample pages chosen at random within this six-month period. These three sample pages recorded total sales of \$31.92, \$89.48, and \$46.89, providing an average total sales per page of \$49.89. Multiplying that average of total sales per page by the total of 230 pages of sales entries for this six-month period results in total sales of approximately \$11,474.70 during this period under review. The itemized sales of housewares listed below total to just \$64.52 out of that total, or half of one percent of the total store sales in that sample time period.

If one were to convert these figures from 1831 to the same purchasing power in today's economy and monetary values, using the *Economic History Service* calculations of consumer price indexes and adjustments for inflation (McCusker 2001), such a conversion indicates that \$11,474.70 in 1831 equals \$233,699.48 today, and \$64.20 in 1831 equals \$1,314.05 today.

This accounting record contains approximately 150 pages of sales entries, with an average of 25 sales transactions recorded on each page, for a total of approximately 3,750 total sales transactions.

Relevant sales transactions involving housewares during that time period are itemized below in a manner similar to the way the store clerks recorded them in the *Daybook*. The sales of housewares listed below total to just 106 sales transactions out of that total of approximately 3,750, or approximately three percent of the total sales transactions in the daybook. The pricing information is listed primarily in pounds, shillings and pence.

This store was located at the southern end of the Loudoun Valley, in the area in which the Demory family resided. A number of the customers listed in this book were neighbors of the Demorys. However, there is no mention of the Demory name in this 1814-1816 *Daybook*. However, a fragmentary and deteriorated *Ledger* book covering customer accounts for this store in the years 1817-1819 lists a “William Demory” as having paid “3 ½” pence in cash for an amount due on May 21, 1819. A second *Ledger*

book, covering the years 1801-1806 contained no references to the name of Demory.

Bell, published by the author, 1898, Leitersburg, Maryland; available at the Washington County Historical Society, Hagerstown, Maryland). The Zeiglers paid the store for these purchases in large part by providing the store with hauling services (*Daybook*, 10/29/1838).

This accounting record, which covers sales in the period of 1841 through 1849, contains approximately 24 pages of sales records, with an average of 18 sales transactions recorded on each page, for a total of approximately 448 sales transactions in that period.

Although this merchandise operation sold an array of fabrics, clothing, groceries and livestock, only two sales transactions involving housewares pertinent to my survey occurred during this time period: on May 1, 1842, William Glasscock purchased “1/2 Doz. German silver tea spoons” for \$1.38 3/4 and “1 coffee pott” for \$.50.

The sales of housewares listed below total to just 141 sales transactions out of that total of approximately 11,088, or approximately one percent of the total sales transactions in the daybook. The pricing information listed includes mixed references to pounds, shilling and pence, and to dollars and cents.

This *Account Book* was used to record the daily sales transactions of a general store that was located in New Market, Shenandoah County, Virginia, and operated by merchant John W. Rice. Relevant portions of this book are organized in the manner of a daybook. This accounting record, which covers sales in the period of 1856 through 1866, contains approximately 230 pages of various accounting records. I reviewed the records for 2 years of merchandise sales, from January 1, 1857 through December 31, 1858 in detail, which were recorded on 58 pages of sales entries, with an average of 8 sales transactions recorded on each page, for a total of approximately 464 total sales transactions in that period.

Although this merchandise operation sold a broad array of groceries, hardware, fabrics, clothing and other products, and provided an array of services, including cooperage, mending shoes, renting pasturage, and hauling and land surveying, it recorded no sales transactions involving housewares pertinent to my survey during this time period.
